Meeting Minutes

An update will likely be needed to include a separate section in Item 5 or Item 8 to include textiles/fabrics for their special purposes. It was suggested that space be

reserved to add information on separator and filter fabrics at a later time. This group would also like to see more representation from local cities and counties on the task force. Missouri is a lead in the use of shingles in pavement. Boulder, Colorado also has a test section. A project was mentioned which involves the use of warm mix technology, recycled shingles, and rubberized asphalt.
